Every one of the 200 runners taking part in Cancer Council's Undies Run 2019 is asked to raise at least \$300. Together, it means we can raise an incredible \$60,000 for bowel cancer research.



\$60,000

can fund 24 travel grants which enable our funded researchers to attend conferences, network, collaborate, and fast-track their research.

Why stop at \$300?

Nothing is stopping you from aiming even higher. Because the more money you raise, the bigger impact you can make for South Australians affected by bowel cancer.

\$70,000

could fund a Translational Research Grant for one year.

\$75,000

can fund a Project Grant for one year.

will take our Undies Run total, since its inception in 2013, to \$960,000—enough to fund four Early Career Research Fellowships for three years.
